Entry Requirements

Those entering this qualification must be able to demonstrate vocational competence in their proposed training and assessing area. Vocational competence is defined as broad industry knowledge and experience, and may include, but is not limited to, holding a relevant unit of competency or qualification.

Appropriate language, literacy, digital literacy and numeracy skills are required. Moderate computer skills are also required. Students will require access to a computer, internet, and headphones at home for the “Real time” Zoom delivery classes. A camera is recommended but not essential.

Application Procedure

Prospective students are required to participate in a Pre-Training Review to determine their suitability to participate in the program. Prospective students complete a language, literacy and numeracy assessment to identify whether they meet the entry requirements and to determine if modification of training and assessment strategies is required.

Training and Assessment Methods

Assessment will be conducted using different methods, including written assignments, presentations, observations, projects and case studies. All assessments are directly linked to the work performance criteria specified in the units of the qualification.

Recognition of Existing Skills and Knowledge

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) takes into account the knowledge and skills you've already gained through your previous education and work. This may be through formal or informal learning, paid or unpaid work experience. All students will be offered RPL application information at the pre-Training Review.

ACE Scholarships Program
